Audubon Texas works with chapters and partners to protect and manage colonial waterbird populations in every major bay system on the Texas Gulf Coast, have launched a robust urban conservation program, and are developing an innovative prairie and grassland conservation that engages provide landowners and ranchers throughout the state. Additionally, Audubon Texas works to identify and conserve the most important sites for birds statewide, and are working to serve 75,000 visitors annually through conservation education and stewardship action at the Audubon Centers in Cedar Hill, Dallas and San Antonio.
