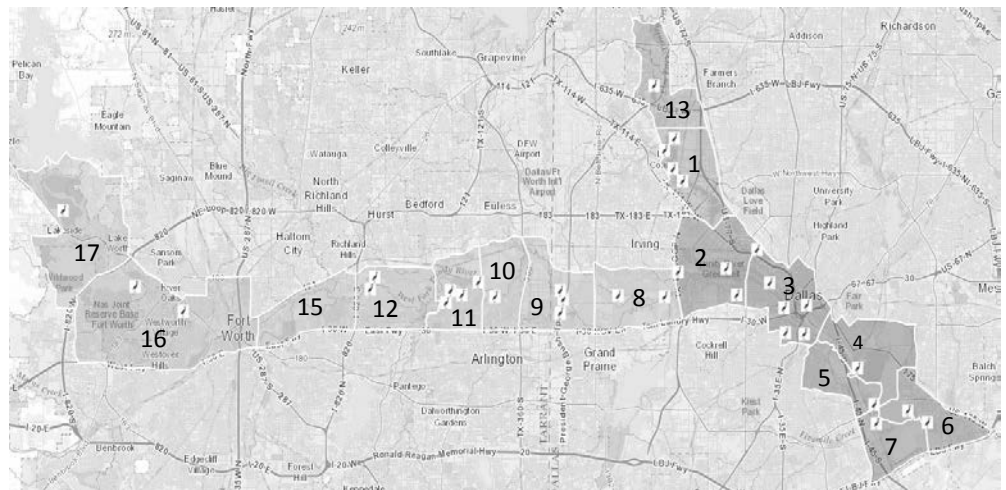
Trinity Bird Count

Since 2011 the Trinity Bird Count has been a partnership between the Trinity Commons Foundation, Trinity River Corridor Project, Strategic Community Solutions, and Audubon Texas to collect information about critical Texas bird species.

The Trinity Bird Count focuses on the Trinity River and adjacent areas through the Dallas-Fort Worth Metroplex. This corridor is divided into 17 areas along the Elm, West, East and main forks of the Trinity River.

To participate with a team and receive emails regarding upcoming team counts you can sign up online at www.tx.audubon.org. You can also participate on your own by visiting any of the designated areas throughout the year, and then sharing your observations with the Trinity Bird Count. To share your data with the count you must first report your results on eBird, and then "share" the checklist with the following email address:
